Huntingwood - Timeline

Before the settlement of New South Wales by Europeans, the Blacktown district was inhabited by the Darug Aboriginal people, who are the traditional owners and ongoing custodians of the land. We pay our respect to elders past and present, and acknowledge the Aboriginal people for their custodianship of the land.

This composite name was chosen because the first English-style hunting is said to have taken place here and the 'Woods Estate', owned by the Woods family for nearly a century, is located within the suburb.

The Huntingwood area was previously part of Eastern Creek and the suburb is managed as part of the Eastern Creek area, along with Arndell Park. For history before the 1980s, please see the Eastern Creek suburb timeline.
