## **Schofields - Timeline**

Before the settlement of New South Wales by Europeans, the Blacktown district was inhabited by the Darug Aboriginal people, who are the traditional owners and ongoing custodians of the land. We pay our respect to elders past and present, and acknowledge the Aboriginal people for their custodianship of the land.

Named for early settler John Schofield, who had a square mile (259 ha) of land. Schofield's Siding was built on this land in 1870. The suburb is 1.021 hectares in size.

1969	Schofields Flying Club established in 1969 and incorporated in 1971.
1973	Construction/extension of Schofields Community Centre completed.
1974	Riverstone Schofields Junior Soccer Club formed. Schofields Park (Reserve 87) gazetted on 4 January.
1976	Population 1,373 (Census). The number of dwellings is 389.
