Significance

Statement Of Significance

5 Sarsfield Street is a significant brick building representing the Victorian development in the Blacktown area where the original larger land grants were divided into small 30 acre farm lots. This Victorian development pre-dated the Blacktown Estate, and the cottage represents this earlier layer of history.

Criteria a)

Historical Significance

5 Sarsfield Street represents the late Victorian era of development in Blacktown and is a rare Victorian Brick Cottage in the Blacktown CBD.

Criteria c)

Aesthetic/Technical Significance

The building is an example of a substantial late Victorian cottage with features that demonstrate a moderate middle class wealth and aesthetic to the owner including French windows to the frontage, and sandstone sill (rendered), and a loft detail in the gable.

Criteria e)

Research Potential

The repair of the cottage may reveal significant former finishes and details. The site may contain archaeological remains of former structures.

Criteria f)

Rarity

The cottage is a rare remaining example of the Victorian era of development around Blacktown.
