## **Significance**

### **Statement Of Significance**

Lytton cottage is highly significant as a rare remaining colonial convict built building in proximity to the Blacktown CBD.

#### Criteria a)

### **Historical Significance**

Lytton Cottage is historical significance as a rare remaining example of the colonial development in Blacktown near the Blacktown CBD and along Richmond Road. The skewed orientation of the house in accordance with the alignment of Richmond Road indicates its original construction was to orientate toward that major colonial road, rather than the current road alignments around it.

## Criteria c)

#### Aesthetic/Technical Significance

The cottage has aesthetic significance as a colonial building within the Blacktown Central Urban area.

### Criteria e)

### **Research Potential**

The Cottage has high potential to provide research opportunities into the colonial past of Blacktown and is likely to contain colonial building techniques and examples of convict labour.

### Rarity

A single storey masonry dwelling with galvanised iron hipped roof and separately roofed verandah.

The building is made of convict made bricks and may have a shingle roof under the corrugated iron roofing.

The building has been built to face north reflecting its original frontage having been likely to have been to Richmond Road, as an early farm house. This is evidenced by the main hall and frontage windows facing north.

However the current street frontage is to the south and west, with new windows and doors having been placed along this elevation in its modern use after subdivision in the 1960's.

The interior detail has mostly been removed, except some remaining french doors in the eastern section of the house. The outline and window heads etc. of former windows remain in place.

Front and rear verandahs are modern.

A slab out building on the site is a modern construction.

#### **Modifications And Dates**

Some window openings have been adjusted, verandahs have been replaced and interiors have been modernised. A new flat roofed pergola has been added to the side.

## **History**

#### **Historical Notes or Provenance**

#### Updated

Located on the alignment of Richmond Road but also in close proximity to the Blacktown town centre, the cottage is likely to be an early colonial cottage within one of the original land grants of Captain Lethbridge.

Lytton Estate is noted within the Kildare Estate Holding of Captain Lethbridge; with an identification of 1540 acres leased land in a c 1850 Parish Map (undated but does not show the railway line).

The land around the cottage was subdivided in the 1960's such that the house no longer faces the main street address.

The cottage was owned by the Dawes family from 1988 - 1995, when the property was listed as a heritage item. After 1995 the cottage was converted to a medical centre and much of the interior detail is likely to have been removed at this time.

The cottage was used after subdivision in the 1960's as a Medical Centre. At this time a number of internal alterations were made. The cottage has been vacant for a number of years until its purchase in 2014.

Further research is required into this property.
