Significance

Statement Of Significance

These obelisks mark the main highway between Sydney and Penrith and the distance to and from each. There are several located along the Great Western Highway within the City of Blacktown and adjoining Local Government Areas. They are highly significant relating to the 1818 completion of the Great Western Highway.

Criteria a)

Historical Significance

The Milestones are of State Significance as the original milestones marking the great western highway which when laid out in 1818 became the most significant road in the development of the colony of NSW beyond the Sydney Basin. While they are no longer located in their exact original location they relate to their original location, and mark the significance of the Great Western Road to the opening up of the Colony.

Criteria c)

Aesthetic/Technical Significance

The milestones are a rare remaining example of original colonial road marking techniques.

Rarity

Remaining milestones located in proximity to their original locations are rare within Australia.

Prospect Hill was first explored and named in 1788 as "Bellvue". In 1804 large areas of prospect were set aside for Government Stock and a Common for the use of local settlers. The Great Western Highway commenced in 1814 and was finished by 1818.

The builder of the road was William Cox who had also built the road over the Blue Mountains.

The milestones were commissioned in 1814 from Edward Cureton who was paid to make 54 milestones for the great Western road to Penrith.
