The name Kalamata originates from the Kalamata region in Greece, which is famous for olive growing. The entrance fences mark the original winery entrance

CONCLUSION	The former entry drive for the Minchinbury Winery site has limited uses. Although it has the potential for greater local uses, it should not be overdeveloped. There is potential for a low key local harvest festival to be developed and for greater pedestrian and cycle movement through the area. The gates are currently inconspicuous by virtue of their location on a hill. It is probably best they they remain inconspicuous until such time that their survival against vandalism can be assured.
RECOMMENDATIONS	Integrate Row of Olives into local pedestrian and cycleway networks Conduct annual inspection of condition of trees and entry structures for ongoing care Consider the development of a local (olive) harvest festival/event
