One of a group of three original identical cottages in Gidley Street. A rare example of an extant historic residence in St. Marys which demonstrates development in the late nineteenth century.

Historical Significance

The cottage demonstrates a phase in the residential development in the village of St. Marys.

Criteria c)

Aesthetic/Technical Significance

The cottage is a good example of its style which retains key characteristics such as roof and plan form and detailing.

Criteria g)

Representative

The cottage is part of a group which represents a fair percentage of the extant historic structures in St. Marys which collectively demonstrate the pattern of a village settlement. Collectively these structures imbue the area with high historic and aesthetic values.

Physical Description	Updated
No. 42 Gildey Street is a quaint late nineteenth century brick Gothick Revival cottage which is one of a pair of extant buildings of like design. The cottage has cement rendered external walls lined as ashlar masonry with vermiculated quoins, and moulded label moulds and window sills. The roof is half hipped with a gabled projecting wing sheeted in corrugated metal. The gable has a finely fretted decorated bargeboard. The front verandah has a bullnose profiled roof supported on timber posts. There is an attached rear service wing. The cottage is set within a narrow and deep allotment close to the street boundary.

Further Comments
Both no. 38 and no 40 Gidley Street share stylistic traits that are also common with neighbouring Mimosa (ie. the rendered medallion and vermiculated quoins) which suggest all three buildings share the same architect (William Sykes).
