Significance

Statement Of Significance

The building is a good example of a brick working class cottage from the late nineteenth century associated with Thompsons tannery and demonstrates the evolution of a village settlement after the coming of the railway.

Criteria a)**Historical Significance**

The cottage demonstrates a phase in the development of St. Marys in the 1880s and after the coming of the railway with the building of brick cottages within the village area. It also demonstrates the evolution of Thompsons tannery and is one of the few remaining extant structures associated with the tannery.

Criteria c)**Aesthetic/Technical Significance**

The house is a good example of a late Victorian suburban cottage which retains key characteristics such as roof, plan, form and detailing.

Criteria g)**Representative**

The building is one of a number of structures in St Marys erected over the nineteenth century and early part of the twentieth century that demonstrates the evolution of a village settlement.

The late nineteenth century brick cottage has a symmetrical elevation with front verandah. The roof is gabled with a bullnose profiled roof over the verandah supported by timber posts with chamfered edges. The centrally located door is flanked by timber framed sash windows (2 over 2). Originally set within a narrow and deep allotment close to the street boundary, the cottage now forms part of a medium-density residential complex under construction at the time of the site inspection.
