Significance

Statement Of Significance

Fairholme is historically significant as a rare remaining example of a Victioran country manner of a wealthy land owner, and indicates a historic grouping of homestead and service buildings.

Criteria a)

Historical Significance

The Property is of high local significance as the substantial early Victorian farm holding of the Evans family with a commanding presence and views over the Rooty Hill district.

Criteria b)

Historical Association

Significance

The House has social significance in association with early significant settlers of the Rooty Hill district.

Criteria c)

Aesthetic/Technical Significance

The homestead and outbuildings are a highly informative grouping of an early Victorian farm manor, built to maximise views and a sense of presence within the neighbourhood. The buildings contain significant construction features, details and interiors that provide an understanding of the early Victorian aesthetic.

The building includes unusual details in the size and sculpting of the tapered timber verandah posts and the elegant symmetrical arrangement of the french doors to the verandah.

Criteria e)

Research Potential

The Fairholme Group is of high research potential including archaeological remains in and around the building group, as well as the revealing of older finishes and building layout arrangements in the less altered rear service wings.

Criteria g)

Representative

Fairholme is representative of the large farm estates of wealthy landowners in the Rooty hill district which were built to maximise the scenic qualities of the area including long range views to Sydney and to the Blue Mountains.

Physical Description

The remaining buildings from the original residential home use of Fairholme include the main homestead building, two small out buildings, service wings to the rear, a well, a pergola and cistern. There is some mention of an underground tunnel connecting the well and the cistern, but this has not been confirmed.

The main house and rear outbuildings are stone and brick construction with rendered walls. Original doors, windows, interiors and fireplaces remain.

The main house wing is a simple rectangular building with wrap around deep verandahs that would once have had a commanding view over the Rooty Hill district. The house features tapered timber columns on the verandah and elegant tall French doors from each room onto the verandah.

The property is now a school and a westerly two storey wing has been added to the homestead as part of the first school development in the 1960's. This was done in a style compatible with the homestead. Other school buildings are located to the east of the homestead.

The building is currently used for administration within the school.
