The house is a typical timber framed, five roomed, Edwardian gable fronted weatherboard house, with internal timber linings and a rear kitchen wing. A front and rear verandah and pressed metal window awnings are also original remaining elements.

Despite being relocated in the 1950's the building retains its timber boarded walls, pressed metal and timber boarded ceilings, coal grates and fireplaces.
