Significance

Statement Of Significance

Recently restored and reconstructed, Moore's Cottage is a rare and uniquely intact example of a colonial era pise de terre construction technology. The building demonstrates early village settlement in the area. The building, though surrounded by modern development, is a picturesque remnant of the colonial era character of St Marys now largely vanished. The cottage is an example of the mid-nineteenth century Colonial Vernacular style of architecture which is likely to be the oldest extant building in the village area of St Marys. The building is one of a number of structures in St Marys erected over the nineteenth century and early part of the twentieth century that demonstrate the evolution of suburban settlement at this locale.

The cottage demonstrates the earliest phase of European settlement in the village area of St Marys.

The cottage is an excellent example of the mid-nineteenth century Colonial Vernacular style of architecture.

Physical Description

The item is a cottage on Sainsbury Street, which has recently been restored and reconstructed as part of a medium density residential development. The main walls are of pise de terre construction with lime plaster stucco, lined out in imitation of ashlar masonry. An internal cross wall and back to back chimneys are of sandstock brick construction. The floors are timber. The roof framing is largely reconstructed bush pole framing supported on hardwood verandah posts and beams. The whole of the roof is covered with hardwood shingles under a corrugated metal sheeting. The bell-cast hipped roof sweeps low over the front and side verandahs and walls with multiple-paned (9 over 9) sashed windows. The asymmetrical front elevation has an off-centre door and one off-centre chimney. The cottage is set close to the street and is a conspicuous atypical element in the streetscape.

History

Historical Notes or Provenance

The general area forms part of the 600 acres granted to Mary Putland, the daughter of former Governor William Bligh in 1806. The grant was named Frogmore Farm. After the death of John Putland, Mary married in 1810 Lieut. Colonel Maurice O'Connell. Governor Macquarie granted Mary an additional 1055 acres, which was named Coallee. The O'Connells left the colony in 1814 and did not return until 1838. With the financial downturn of the early 1840s, the estates were mortgaged in 1841. In April 1842 a subdivision of 1000 acres of the estates was offered for sale with village allotments and 10 & 50 acre paddock allotments, but only about 50 acres was sold. The O'Connell family defaulted on its mortgaged land in 1854 and the estates were bought by Sydney solicitor Andrew Hardie McCullock in 1855 who released the land once again for sale in the same year. The land associated with the cottage formed part of Lot 39 (over five acres) of the subdivision acquired by farmer Thomas Shadlow in 1856. In 1872, two acres of Shadlow's land, and probably inclusive of the cottage, was sold to John Burgess. In the early 1920s the cottage was tenanted by local woodcutter George Thomas Moore and his wife Catherine. The Moore family association continued until 2001. The site was purchased by CMS Pty Ltd in 2002 and was redeveloped for townhouses retaining the restored and reconstructed historic cottage.
