Nu-Welwyn is of historic significance as a rare remaining brick homestead and outbuildings complex that retains a significant garden including layout and remnant herbaceous and mature trees, and general hilltop setting.

Criteria a)

Historical Significance

Nu Welwyn if of historic significance to the Riverstone area as a rare remaining farm homestead and complex on the outer edge of the town, that was occupied by the one family (Rumery) for a substantial period of its development.

Criteria c)

Aesthetic/Technical Significance

Nu Welwyn has high aesthetic significant as a Victorian brick homestead with a substantial servants quarter, and garden setting, including remaining significant herbaceous plants and mature trees, driveway layout and farm out buildings and setting.

Criteria e)

Research Potential

The homestead complex and garden have high potential to reveal the former footprint and layout of the Homestead, gardens and outbuildings of the farm complex.

Rarity

A brick country homestead, in a landscaped garden, dominated by a white cedar tree, mature plantings, remnant herbaceous plants, and a sweeping driveway approach.

The house consists of two distinct sections including the more ornate homestead section with a bell cast verandah which is likely to be the main residential wing, and a kitchen, Laundry and servants quarters wing. These are currently joined by a modern addition which may replace an earlier structure.

The size of the servants quarters indicates a substantial home establishment was accommodated, which may indicate the modern sections of the building replace perhaps former weatherboard sections of the main homestead.

The frontage with the concave verandah has Italianate wrought iron pilasters similar to those found at Hebe (14 Bridge Street), and Rosebank 213 Garfield Road East, indicating a potential link through builder or ownership.

The interior of the cottage section retains original fireplaces and detail. The kitchen wing has been modernised however the structure of the kitchen and servants quarters remains clear.

The gardens contains the remain of highly ornate gardens with older herbaceous plantings including plumb ago, climbing roses etc., laid out in a Victorian cottage pattern with brick paths and edging remaining in some places.
