Statement Of Significance

The St Marys general cemetery dedicated in 1881 is the earliest and largest general cemetery in the LGA. Its establishment demonstrates the aging population in the St Marys/Werrington nexus over the late nineteenth and early twentieth century and the emergence of a large suburban population at this time. The cemetery is a good example of a general cemetery formally laid out and is indicative of its era as demonstrated by its network of paths, and materials and style of memorial stones.

Physical Description Updated

The item is a general cemetery situated on the Great Western Highway to the east of St Marys. The cemetery comprises a near square block. It is an elevated site with a slight grade to the east. The cemetery has a formal layout of paths and reserves for the denominations which at the time of dedication were Church of England, Presbyterian, Lutheran, Wesleyan Methodist, Independent, and Roman Catholic. The cemetery is characterised by its regular alignment of memorial stones orientated on an east-west axis. The older monuments tend to be clustered in the margins of a path with an asphalt surface on a north-south axis. The path is bordered by shade trees. The original cement rendered gateposts are located at the southern end of the path at the Great Western Highway. Other paths are concrete paved. This historic access ceased with the installation of the aluminium railing fencing which encloses the cemetery. The grounds are screened from the highway by a row of trees. The Major plantings are brush on southern boundary and bottlebrush along central drive, and cotoneaster along western boundary. The cemetery has a small concrete block store.
