The main building is a purpose built two storey seminary with features of Interwar Revival architectural styles, built in brick with terra-cotta tiles. Across the main body of the building stretches a loggia with conncrete columns, with projecting gables at each end on the front and back. The projecting gables have single-storey rounded bays and a timber ventilator in centre of each gable. Windows are timber, double-hung, with horizontal glazing bars and timber louvre shutters to upper floor windows. French doors flank the front door under the colonnade. Main doors are double timber doors with five panels. Double timber doors with glazed upper panels are at the rear. Paling fence and gate. Vine growing over loggias. Rose gardens and mature native trees in extensive grounds. Additional wings were added in 1937 (south) and 1938 (north wing). Sandstone stepped segmental arch above front door. A corrugated iron building at rear of main building. The north wing was dedicated to the memory of Marist missionaries who lost their lives in WWII Pacific theatre, dedicated Sunday 25 October 1953 by Cardinal Gilroy. After the Marist Fathers, the complex was occupied by Fransican monks and currently by a Catholic educative establishment.
