

Werrington Downs – Timeline

Werrington Downs forms part of Phillip Parker King's original 1831 land grant, St Stephens. It was developed by Landcom as a residential estate from the late 1970s with the last lots being released in August 1981.

The suburb's name is derived from the house by Governor King's daughter, Mary and her husband Robert Copland Lethbridge. Werrington House was completed in 1832. Mary's Farm was run as a farming estate until the land was subdivided in the 1880s.
